According to the Ministry, positive changes in the speed of the Internet have taken place in Uzbekistan over the past year. According to the analysis, the speed of the Internet has increased by almost 2.3 times. As of March 2019, it is 11.62 Mbit / s. 26.77 Mbit / s as of June 1, 2020. formed. As of June 15, 2020, the Internet speed in Uzbekistan is 27.59 Mbit / s.




Figure. 1. Different ways of Distance Learning

In Uzbekistan, a recent UNICEF study (2019) shows that television is the key media channel with the largest audience among respondents aged from 14 to 30 years. Television also ranks first as the most authoritative source of information for young people. The UNICEF Knowledge, Attitude and Practice (KAP) study on the quality of general education and community participation in schoolbased management (2020) results show that 98% of the households with school going children in the country owns a television. The KAP study also reveals that only around 40% of the school-going children are computer literate (can operate a computer) and only 37% are digital literates. Less than 30% of children in rural areas knew how to use digital devises. This shows that high-tech online based distance learning will leave out a large majority of school going children from accessing education.

According to the researcher of the World, Because of definitely rules of quarantine, education especially, the Higher Education system has increased. Because of the Quarantine, every education place for example schools, universities, colleges has to switch to distance(online) learning. However, there were some problems.

For instance, teachers and students don't have enough knowledge to Internet technologies, low internet speed, in some country there is no internet connection or very poor connection and some student also in their family doesn't have any gadget (laptop, computer, the mobile phone you name it) to connect the internet. Undoubtedly, this situation has negatively affected the quality of education, technical failures and other factors have led to disruptions in the learning process. However, according to experts of the world, the strict rules of pandemic made new opportunities to the Higher Education.

In particular, Armenia has launched a single iUniversity platform for universities that allows distance learning during quarantine, 5 for learning and doing business in the UAE global network: Google Hangouts Meet, Cisco Webex, Avaya Spaces, Blue Jeans and Apps called Slack started running continuously. In Cyprus, the Ministry of Education and Science, through the Pedagogical Institute, has organized a rapid training of teachers for distance learning. In Russian universities, the use of augmented reality technology (Vremya news program on Russia's First Channel, aired on May 12, 2020) has become an innovation in education.

Online education has served to develop this system for at least 10 years. For reference: In 2018, a report published by the international publication (Time higher education) predicted that by 2030, only elite universities will switch to online education. Today, the COVID-19 pandemic was fasted this process. During the quarantine period, teachers acquired the skills of distance learning (Moodle), online, lecturing on various platforms (ZOOM, Telegram) and video recording (Bandicam, OBS-studio). This has served as a resource for many higher education institutions to create a large media platform consisting of video lessons.

In general, most universities and institutes in Uzbekistan were partially ready to offer distance learning. A Moodle system was created on the platforms of higher education institutions, which contained electronic resources for all subjects. However, despite the fact that the system was introduced a few years ago, its implementation was slow in practice, so it was natural to face its own problems and difficulties in the introduction of emergency distance learning for the first time in the history of our country.

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
